Sharp Swan, historian, will share the story of the people who worked the Adirondack High Peaks bringing timber off the slopes to market. A dangerous and precarious job, lumbering was done by brute manpower and horses often in deep snows and frigid winter temperatures, in logging camps high in the mountains, and facing swollen rivers filled with log jams. Being a lumberjack was a tough occupation. Free and open to the public.
